## System cards

Another gentle reminder ...

The recent intermediate pairs event, saw many players enter this sort of event for the first time – which was fantastic! However, some did not have a system card. While some leeway is given for less experienced players at club events, it is a BAWA requirement that matching system cards are made available *by each member of a partnership* at **any red point event, including any SPBC members-only event**. So please take the time to get one now and be ready for the next event!

Having a system card helps to eliminate a lot of question asking and, hopefully, reduces the incidence of *unauthorised information*. The club has a supply of simple system cards that are ideal for use by players whose system is straightforward. Completing one of these with your partner can be a great way to ensure you have a common understanding of your system and the conventions that you have agreed to play. If you have different agreements with different partners, you will need a system card for each partnership.

If you would like a system card to complete, please ask a Director. If you need help to complete it, there are many members who have cards who would be willing to help!

| <b>Can pull-back tops</b>                             | ✓ | Please keep separate from other materials and place in the container  |
| <b>Plastic lids</b>                                   | ✓ | Please keep separate and place in the container – preferably with the paper or cardboard inserts already removed.               |
| <b>Assorted small plastic items (as in the photo)</b> | ✗ | These are not being collected as they cannot be sorted by the recycling machines. Please put these in your rubbish bins at home |
| <b>Metal lids</b>                                     | ✗ | These are not being collected. Please put in your own recycling bins at home  |
