
## Mobile Phones

## More from the Library

**Killing Defence at Bridge, by Hugh Kelsey.** This book is considered a must-read for intermediate to advanced bridge players and has been praised for its clarity and depth.



With world sales exceeding 100,000 this book is recognised as one of the classics of bridge literature written by one of the foremost analysts of bridge. Virtually every great player throughout the world highly recommends it.

It carries the mark of a genius and was the first in a series of major books written by Hugh Kelsey, who became internationally recognised as a leading authority on the analysis of bridge. He coupled this incisive thinking with a brilliant skill with words and made the most complex techniques in bridge sound simple and easy to grasp.

The book covers the following defensive strategies:

### Defensive Bidding Strategies

- **Interference Bids:** Learn when and how to make interference bids to disrupt your opponent's bidding sequence.
- **Double and Redouble:** Master the art of using double and redouble effectively to communicate with your partner and put pressure on opponents.

### Card Play Techniques

### Endplay Strategies

- **Throw-In Plays:** Learn to manoeuvre opponents into winning trick situations where they must lead favourably for your side.
- **Strip and Endplay:** Master the technique of stripping an opponent's exit cards to force them into giving you the advantage.

- **Practice Hands:** There are practice hands for you to try out and improve your defensive play.
